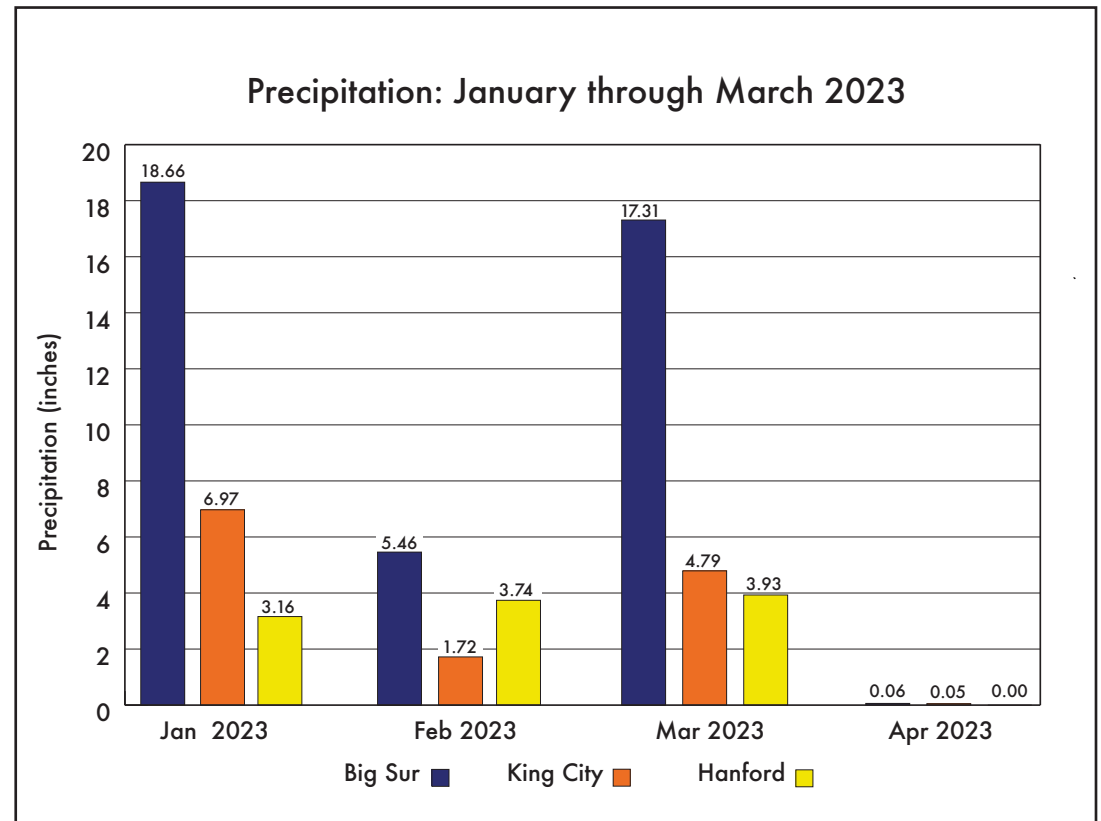

# Parts of the Valley under Water!

The water supplies in parts of the Central Valley remain polluted today. Water from unusually heavy rains washed across fields. Fertilizers, animal waste, and soil got mixed into the water. The water also flowed across and pooled on roads, in parking lots, and in yards. Levees built to keep water in canals and streambeds couldn't hold the water. Fields may remain underwater for weeks or longer.

The high water caused the evacuation of several communities. Many schools have closed. Classes will be held online for some of the schools. Check school websites for information.

Community managers are getting updates from water facilities. There is no estimate yet about when the water will be safe to drink.
